<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Science</u></b></p> <p>Go outside, observe nature and describe what you see and hear. Students can use verbal, written, and their augmentative communication.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Functional</u></b></p> <p>Pick a new chore around the house such as dusting, putting away toys, clearing the table and complete the choir.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Physical Education</u></b></p> <p>Play “Clean Up the Yard” with your family. Divide the area in half and throw balls or rolled up socks from your side of the “court” to the other side.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Social Studies</u></b></p> <p>Set a goal for this week. What steps will you take to accomplish it?</p>

Help your child identify the letters and read the words. Play “I Spy!” by saying, “I Spy the letter/word _____” and having your child make a guess.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>ELA</u></b></p> <p>Watch ‘The Little Red Hen Makes a Pizza’. Describe how to make a pizza.</p> <p>Video:  <a href="http://bit.ly/2wS8rYs">http://bit.ly/2wS8rYs</a></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>ELA</u></b></p> <p><i>Mystery Sounds:</i> Play a mystery game by saying, "I'm thinking of someone whose name begins with (say the sound for the letter <b>t</b>)," or "I'm looking for an item that begins with (say the sound for the letter <b>g</b>)."</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Math</u></b></p> <p>Put beans (or some other object) in a container. (1-10 objects or 11-21 objects). Make 2 scoops and count each. Have student count the two scoops or write an equation to represent the 2 scoops. Find the difference between the two.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Math</u></b></p> <p>Create your own Open Middle Problems, Example: Using the digits 1 to 9 to create the largest sum possible.
